Welcome to Our Guest Speaker, William Waltersdorff...

We are honored to welcome William "Billy" Waltersdorff as our guest speaker today for Veterans Sunday. Billy is a proud member of our community, born and raised in Spring Grove, where he grew up with a deep connection to the church. We are thrilled to have him with us.

Billy graduated from Spring Grove Area High School in 2011. After finishing high school, he pursued a career in the trades, but he felt a strong calling to do more. In April 2016, he enlisted in the United States Navy and began his journey at Naval Station Great Lakes in Chicago, Illinois for basic training. Following his graduation from basic training, Billy continued his education in Pensacola, Florida, where he received additional specialized training.

Billy was then assigned to HSM-46, an anti-submarine helicopter squadron that operated MH-60R helicopters. From 2016 to 2020, he served with this squadron, participating in a wide range of training exercises, and provided support for humanitarian relief efforts in the aftermath of Hurricane Michael. He also completed a deployment to the Persian Gulf during this time.

In 2020, Billy transitioned to a new duty station with HSC-3, a training squadron based in San Diego, California, where he continued to work with MH-60 helicopters. He spent three years in California before leaving active duty in September 2023 and transitioning into the Navy Reserves. At this point, Billy shifted his career focus and retrained as a steelworker, now serving with a Seabee command in Mississippi.

When Billy isn't serving his country as a member of the Navy Reserve, he is serving his community as an officer in the Penn Township Police Department. Billy is married to Jordin, and they have a three-year old daughter, Raylinn. Billy's parents, Bill and Karla, and his grandmother, Delphine, are also long-time members of our congregation. Billy is deeply grateful for the opportunity to speak today and extends his thanks to the church for the honor of addressing the congregation on this important Veterans Sunday.

Honoring Larry L. Spangler: A Veteran's Story of Service and Dedication



Each year, on Veterans Sunday, St. Peter's Lischey's UCC gathers to pay tribute to the brave men and women who have served—or are currently serving—in our nation's armed forces. Some are members of our congregation and community, many rest in our cemetery, and others remain forever remembered on distant battlefields. As part of this tribute, we shine a special spotlight on a member of our church family who answered the call of duty. This year, we are proud to honor Larry L. Spangler.

Larry was born and raised in Spring Grove, the youngest of five children. His father, Robert, worked as an

electrician at Glatfelter paper company in Spring Grove but tragically passed away in an industrial accident when Larry was only five months old. His mother, Grace, remarried when Larry was 14. Larry's family has a strong legacy of military service: his oldest brother, Robert, who is now 99, served in the Army Air Corps (which later became the U.S. Air Force), and his brother Philip also served in the Air Force, though he has since passed. Larry's sisters, Charlotte Rohrbaugh and Joan Miller, have also left lasting marks on the family, though Joan is now deceased. Larry graduated from Spring Grove Public School and initially went to work in the accounting department at Glatfelter paper company. But in 1958, sensing the inevitability of a draft notice, Larry made the decision to enlist in the U.S. Air Force. He wanted to choose his branch of service, and with several family members already having served in the Air Force, he followed their example.



WITH AIR FORCE — Larry L. Spangler, son of Mrs. Grace L. Tarlton, South East street, Spring Grove, is now stationed at Lackland Air Force base, Tex. He was graduated from Spring Grove Joint District Senior High school. Prior to his enlistment April 7, he was employed by P. H. Glatfelter company.

Larry's journey to military service began with a plane flight from Harrisburg to Lackland Air Force Base in Texas for basic training. It was his first time flying. He then completed his technical training at Lowry Air Force Base in Colorado, where he trained to become a photo specialist—a role that required mastering the use of cameras, as well as the art of processing film and paper in a darkroom.

After finishing his training, Larry was stationed at an Army post near Warrenton, VA, located about 40 miles west of Washington, DC, in the Military District of Washington. Larry's primary responsibility was overseeing stockroom photography, working in a photo lab where he processed aerial images. He also learned how to operate advanced automated equipment. The disciplined nature of military life came easily to Larry, as he was already accustomed to following orders and maintaining structure. He was always good with people, and that is an important quality in the military. His time in the Air Force not only honed his skills but also provided him with many friendships—many of which, unfortunately, faded after he left the service.



During his time in the military, Larry found ways to make the most of his free time. He worked as a singing waiter at a local supper club in Calverton, VA, where he not only served guests but also performed during breaks. On weekends, he also worked as an assistant manager at an upscale restaurant in Manassas, VA. He even occasionally sang at a local dance hall. Despite his busy schedule, Larry was able to visit his family and friends back home in Spring Grove, where his siblings all lived nearby. Two significant events marked Larry's military service. The first was receiving a letter from Linda, who he originally met in high

school, shortly before his enlistment ended, and from then on, he frequently returned home to see her. Their relationship blossomed, and they married about a month after Larry's discharge.

The second event was the Cuban Missile Crisis in October 1962, when an American U-2 spy plane uncovered Soviet missile sites being built in Cuba. The discovery led to a tense two-week standoff between the U.S. and the Soviet Union. Larry, stationed

near Washington, DC, and working with aerial photography, had a unique vantage point, as he was granted access to the secret ortunately, the crisis was resolved peacefully, and Larry completed his

images of the missile sites. Fortunately, the crisis was resolved peacefully, and Larry completed his service in 1962 as an Airman 1st Class.

Upon returning home, Larry went back to work at Glatfelter. Although there were no openings in the accounting department, he began working in the storeroom while attending Penn State York's night school for basic accounting. From there, Larry's career trajectory took off. He took a programmer aptitude test, which led to training as a computer programmer — a role that involves writing software to perform tasks like payroll processing. He later transitioned into the role of systems analyst, where he was responsible for designing entire systems, including the programming aspects. Larry's career culminated in a position as Corporate Manager of Computer Services, overseeing operations at three company locations: Spring Grove, North Carolina, and Wisconsin. He retired from Glatfelter about 25 years ago after many successful years in the field. Larry's beloved wife of 62 years, Linda, passed away recently. Together, they raised three children, Larry Spangler II, Carla Louthian, and Kelli Spangler. Today, Larry is the proud grandparent of nine, great-grandparent to thirteen, and great-great-grandparent to one. His son, Larry Spangler II and his family, are well known to our congregation, as well as his youngest daughter, Kelli, and her children, Jami and Brooke Tomlinson, who we are getting to know.

Larry, we thank you for your years of service to our country and your steadfast dedication to your family and community. You are a cherished part of the long tradition of service and sacrifice embodied by the members of St. Peter's Lischey's UCC.
